

# The Prairie Owl




*Chapter members receive a bi-monthly newsletter, *The Prairie Owl*.*

*The short-eared owl, or “prairie owl,” is a ground-nesting hunter of marshes, open fields, and prairies. Once common throughout the northern United States, including Washington state, short-eared owl populations are in decline due to encroaching development and changing agricultural practices that threaten its natural habitat.*

*In our region, short-eared owls are occasionally seen in remnants of native Palouse prairie and in fallow fields during their spring and fall migrations. They may also be found in winter, if snow depths are shallow and vole populations high.*

Palouse Audubon Society is chartered in Idaho as a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization. We are a chapter of the National Audubon Society and serve the area



covered by Washington counties Asotin and Whitman and Idaho counties Latah and Nez Perce.

Our members share opportunities to observe birds and wildlife on chapter-sponsored field trips—and also learn more about our outdoor environment through monthly educational programs.
